

# Model Questionnaire Measuring the nexus between

gender and environment

### Introduction

The lives of women and men are intrinsically related to the environment. However, women and men may experience these connections differently. Understanding the multi-dimensional nature of the gender-environment nexus requires individuallevel analysis of women's and men's experiences managing natural resources, dealing with hazards, coping with the consequences of climate change and promoting environmental conservation, among many other areas.

To support the collection of official statistics on the gender-environment nexus, UN Women developed this Model Questionnaire, in close consultation with FAO, ILO, IUCN, UNEP, UNDRR and UNESCAP. It can be implemented in full or some modules can be attached to other multipurpose surveys. Ideal vehicles for these modules are surveys that ask questions to both adult males and females randomly (not just heads of household).

Surveys that ask questions to both one male and one female within the same household are also ideal vehicles. If the survey is used as a stand-alone survey, sampling of both one male and one female within the same household is recommended.

• Modules are labeled with "hh" and "i" markings

"hh" modules are meant to be asked to one member of the household only (he or she can respond for all household members)

Modules marked with an "i" are meant to be asked to at least two adults (one male and one female) within the same household

Questions marked in **green** are not typically included in other surveys but are key to capturing genderenvironment dimensions

Instructions marked in **blue** are instructions for the enumerator, and should not be read out loud

Instructions marked in orange are instructions for the respondent, the enumerator should read these out loud

Guidelines for the use of this questionnaire and the calculation of related gender-environment measures, including Sustainable Development Goals indicators, are published in a separate companion report to this Model Questionnaire.
