



## Flagship Programme Initiative: Making Every Woman and Girl Count

## Content

On 2 November 2018, UN Women will convene the fifth meeting of the Steering Committee (SC) of the Flagship Programme Initiative "Making Every Woman and Girl Count" (MEWGC). As agreed during the third SC meeting in October 2017, to facilitate participation, the Fall meeting of the SC will take place in Paris, France, on the margins of the DAC GenderNet annual meeting. The meeting will provide an opportunity to provide updates on the implementation of the programme in 2018; discuss the recently launched Centre of Excellence and present its programme of work; discuss resource mobilization and present the plans for 2019. The meeting will also provide an opportunity to discuss the lessons learned through the country assessments conducted in 2017-2018.

## **Format**

Meetings of the steering committee are important for the programme and UN Women strives to constantly improve them and make them as interactive as possible. For this meeting of the SC, UN Women would like to experiment with a new format by sharing all documents up to two weeks in advance, including all relevant background documents and PowerPoint presentations. During the actual meeting, each agenda item will feature a short five-minute introduction followed by discussions. It is hoped that this new format will allow more time for a richer and more substantive discussion. We would therefore encourage SC members to study the documents carefully before the meeting.
